"Art has the power to bring people together to celebrate, to encourage, and to heal amid this current crisis. This life affirming force is more important than ever." I hope this summer you can explore ways to make and enjoy music.

This is one of the applicant's letters we received this year explaining why they needed a scholarship and why attending Arrowbear was so important to them.




Dear Arrowbear Music Associates,

Music has become one of the biggest parts of my life. In 2016, my ~~o~~ who I was very close to, unexpectedly died from mixed medications. I suffered from severe anxiety and toxic friends, I had a very long grieving process, that's still going on today. When I began playing euphonium in 5th grade, it was simply a nice extracurricular. But then it grew.

Music became my outlet, my coping mechanism for all the overwhelming emotions I felt. The people in my band became my closest friends and support group, my other family. Playing euphonium has grown to be an absolute favorite thing in the world. In fact, I want to go to college for music theory/music education and become a private lesson teacher!

I want to take every opportunity I can, from private lessons to honor bands to Arrowbear Music Camp. However all of it's very expensive and I know I can't go to camp unless I earn some form of Scholarship. My family of 3 only makes ~\$23,000 a year. I've had to sacrifice a lot for private lessons and instrument maintenance costs. Although, I know I can't sacrifice anymore for this camp. I really hope that I'll be chosen. Thank you for your consideration.

Scholarships 2020

We received 39 scholarship applications in April. It's always so difficult to decide who should receive assistance. We agonize, argue passionately for students who touch our hearts in some way, and finally reach a consensus on who gets a scholarship, and who we are unable to help. We walk a delicate line trying to balance merit with need, those who have the advantage of lessons versus those who have potential but perhaps can't afford private lessons, or with students who we know would flourish with the opportunity to have an experience at camp, but perhaps are not yet very proficient technically on their instruments. Still, everyone who listens to the tapes feels an amazing sense of accomplishment that our organization can help so many students. We, and you, do make a difference in these kids' lives.

We are excited to announce that we awarded **\$40,056** in scholarships to all **39** students who applied for the 2020 summer. Due to Arrowbear cancelling their summer program, all of the scholarships will be held until next summer for the recipients. They won't need to reapply, and we'll work with their family to adjust their scholarship amount if needed to fit the session they want to attend in Summer 2021.

In Memoriam

Fran Harding, affectionately known as “Sarge”, passed away on May 18. She first came to Arrowbear in 1953 to conduct at one of the junior high sessions. The next summer she joined the Choral Session staff and participated in teaching and running Choral Session every summer until 1982. She taught music in Long Beach Unified until 1982, but she remained active in music by playing the bassoon in several musical groups and was president of the Musical Arts Club for years.

Lee Smith passed away on February 29, 2020, after a seven-month battle with lung cancer. He enjoyed playing his violin with the Bakersfield Symphony for many years. Lee was a camper, counselor, cook, and staff member from 1949 – 1965.

Joe Burger passed away on December 19, 2019. Known as “Mr. B.”, he was Mr. Ohlendorf’s Assistant Camp Director for 30 years. He taught elementary music in Long Beach where he started numerous generations of youngsters on their instruments. His passing is the end of an era in Arrowbear history.

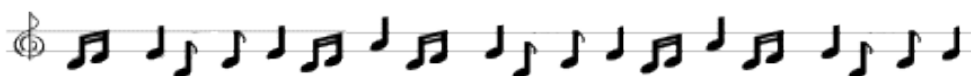
Rick Bartkus passed away on December 4, 2019, from a heart attack. Rick was a fine trombone player who attended camp in the late 1960s and into the early 1970s. He had a talent for making people around him smile.

Martha Ebersole Eads passed away on November 28, 2019, two weeks after suffering a stroke. Martha was a camper from 1947-1952. She served as a staff member for a number of years into the 1970s. Martha was an active violinist who played in chamber groups in Northern California.

Bruce Ford Sr. passed away on November 14, 2019, from a heart attack. Bruce was a Choral camper and counselor in the 1970s and into the 1980s. His wife and children all attended Arrowbear. Bruce was active in his church and in the Japanese Cultural Center.

Barbara Hawes Lasch passed away in November 2018 from complications from Alzheimer’s. She was a camper from 1946 - 1949 and played the cello. She remembered her time at Arrowbear with great fondness.

Gary Robinson passed away on November 20, 2017, from neuroendocrine carcinoma. He was a camper in the 1960s. Gary was a violinist and camp soloist for many years. He met his wife, Pat Mumford Robinson, at Arrowbear.
